## WELCOME to the USAC MOPAR "Generation Next" Round 5 at Orange Show

Orange Show Quarter Midget's Amazing Journey

Orange Show Quarter Midgets grew from the Pomona Valley QMC, that lost their facility in 2007, after a 50 year history of youth racing. With no permanent facility available, families brought their kids to race on the newly paved infield of the 1/4 mile Orange Show Speedway Track. With very limited funds, the club purchased mobile plastic race barriers. It took club members 2 hours to set up and 2 hours to take down the barriers, each raceday. Even though it was tough, the club worked together to stay together for their kids. There was no longer a snack bar which was the only means of raising funds and in order to practice or race, the club had to rent the track for \$500. per day. Needless to say, 2007 was a very tough year! Despite all the road blocks and adversity, Orange Show never gave up. They made several presentations to the National Orange Show Fairgrounds to purchase land



to build a race facility. They pursued sponsorships of every kind. They did numerous fundraisers, exhibition races and worked food booths at Auto Club Speedway for NASCAR events. In addition, they were able to promote their club at these events. With many "Arrive & Drive" Days, Orange Show continued to grow and show the Fairgrounds they were worthy of keeping.

In February 2008, just one year later, the Fairgrounds offered Orange Show a lease on 5 acres of land south of the Big Speedway, were there was a 100 year old dump site with 30' mounds of concrete, asphalt, railroad ties, tree trunks,& other miscellaneous items. Orange Show didn't shy away, but went full force forward. Kandice Attridge led the way to raise over \$40,000 in fundraisers and received donations over \$450,000 in







labor and materials to build the amazing facility they have today. Ken Thompson Inc & Ed Borges were the top two donators, each donating over \$130,000 to the facility. Orange Show's Grand Opening was in May 2008. The track was built using similar dimensions to the Pomona Quarter Midget Track. Orange Show became the 1st quarter midget track in the country to break a 5 second lap. It is the home to the "4 Second Club" & and is the Fastest Quarter Midget Track in the Country. Orange Show has continued improving the facility by including a 3 lane 10 car deep covered staging area, a new tech shed, including roll over scales, track lights and a new PA system. They have continued doing fundraisers, exhibition races and publicity events. Orange Show started with approximately 15 families and currently has over 50 drivers & 70 cars, including 17 new Rookie families.

We are very proud of this club and facility and love to share it with all the quarter midget families across the









country. Some say Kandice Attridge bleeds Orange... "I am very proud of of this club and what we have accomplished. The most important thing I hope I have shown to all the children across the country. is that *if you make goals, be persistent, work hard and never give up - your dreams will come true.*"
